

## Message from the Chair...

Jeronne, our Senior Youth Worker, was offered his dream job shortly after we wrote last time, and is now the Youth Pastor at his home church. Jeronne was incredibly popular with the young people and achieved a great deal at Club: we are very grateful for his time here and wish him the very best in his new role.

We decided not to recruit a replacement immediately, and Stuart, Debbie and the team of volunteers have really stepped up and kept the show on the road. Daniel and Linda have joined us, working half of the week at Club and half at local churches: they've been amazing, hitting the ground running. We've also been very fortunate to have Matt Perry join us for one day a week to support the team. Matt is the Operations Manager at Worth Unlimited and has done a great job in keeping clubs running, supporting the team, and ensuring that we continue to improve what we do day to day.

We've been glad to welcome Andrew Brown onto the Management Committee. Andrew lived in Kilburn for many years, and is a Chartered Surveyor and the Managing Director of Ash Mill Developments; a property development company. We are still looking for additional members to join the committee – ideally with legal, fundraising, or governance experience – and we're particularly keen to find local residents who might join us.

The main entrance and activity area in club has had a welcome refurbishment, for free, courtesy of United Living and Network Housing who are developing flats locally and spent their "community day(s)" repainting, flooring. It looks fantastic! Huge thanks to Sam and his team. Unfortunately, at

about the same time the main boiler was condemned and turned off.

I wrote last time that we would be thinking radical



thoughts about our future: we have been. As a result we are now in the middle of discussions with Brent Council and South Kilburn Trust (SKT - a local charity). We are hoping to find a way to jointly refurbish and modernise the community facilities for Club and SKT to use, and at the same time provide long-term financial security for the work of Club. We expect that the viability of this scheme will become clear in the next few months.

Last week, I was re-reading the history of Club, from the early days to 2006 (would anyone like to volunteer to write up another decade?!) and was struck again by God's faithfulness to Club over the years, through all the ups and downs. Right now, when the details of the future seem particularly uncertain, it's good to remember God has the big picture covered.

In the meantime, as ever, the work continues. Thank you to those of you that have been in touch with us after the last prayer letter. Thank you to all of you who continue to hold the team, the work, the children and young people in your prayers.

I hope you have a very happy Christmas, and I hope we might see you at the prayer day on **Saturday**, **5**<sup>th</sup> **March 2016**.

"Hi everybody.

"Hope all is well? Christmas has come on fast, and the Junior team at the OK Club has been working very hard! This new academic year has been great so far.

"Along with old regular volunteers from CHH we have had Daniel Schultze from Berlin Mission, and Linda Seuthe from Time for God joining us for a years internship (shared with two other churches; St Peter's CofE, Notting Hill, and St Luke's CofE, West Kilburn), and I really enjoy spending time supervising and working alongside them. They are popular with the children who come to our after school sessions, and step by step as a newly formed team we are doing new things together such as sharing new crafts, new and energetic games in the sports hall, and also planning activities. Please pray that both Linda and Daniel have an



amazing time here at the OK Club; that they grow in wisdom, confidence, and strength, so that when they go back to Germany they will feel confident to further explore what God has in store for them.

"Schools wise, I am in St Luke's Primary school at the moment, mentoring a boy in year 4. He's a great kid (as all children are!) but has a load of baggage to deal with both with home life and also showing empathy to others in school. I was asked to come in through a link with St Luke's Church, and since September I have been getting to know him and who he is. I found he has a particular liking for cartoon characters. I regularly draw his character ideas as a way to engage him in deeper conversation about his behaviour, relating the character to him as a person and his strengths and weaknesses. It's progress, he still is a cause for concern at school behaviourally, but I have been invited to come back next term and I will be working with him and another boy in his class on teamwork and respect for others. Please keep this new avenue of work in your prayers that I'll be able to a consistent role model for him and for him to develop emotionally and mentally in regards to his behaviour."

### LINDA FROM LUEBECK


"Hi, my name is Linda and I'm 19 years old. I am from the northern part of Germany, a town called Luebeck, and for the following year I'm resident in London.

"I'm in love with traveling around and it's my dream to travel out of Europe once to visit countries with different cultural and social backgrounds.


